Example: Linear Park in Limassol















- Banks of River Garyllis transformed into linear park (5.5 km)
 - Regeneration of neglected area
 - Creation of cycling infrastructure for commuting, recreational cycling, and tourists
 - Connects northern residential areas, university, city centre, seaside, ...
- EUR 14 million, ERDF

 Urban Development




Cohesion policy 2021-2027

Integrated framework for regional and urban development

With direct and indirect investments relevant for air quality:

- Air quality measures
- Energy efficiency
- Renewable energy
- Sustainable transport
- Eco-innovation
- Uptake of new technologies
- Environmentally-friendly production processes
- Industrial transition







Policy objectives

- 1. A smarter Europe (innovative & smart economic transformation)
- 2. A greener, low-carbon Europe (including energy transition, the circular economy, climate adaptation and risk management)
- 3. A more connected Europe (mobility and ICT connectivity)
- **4. A more social Europe** (the European Pillar of Social Rights)
- A Europe closer to citizens (sustainable development of urban, rural and coastal areas and local initiatives)

Horizontal issues: administrative capacity building, cooperation outside the programme area

ERDF: PO 1-5

Cohesion Fund: PO 2-3 (excl. broadband)



Main novelties for synergies with other EU funds

Strategic level:

- Strategic planning process links Cohesion Policy to European Semester
- Complementarity of ERDF with Horizon Europe, Digital Europe, Single Market Programme, etc.

Financial level:

- More links and bridges between different programmes
- More Simplified Cost Options: Unit costs, fixed rates, lump sums, including replicating those in directly managed programmes for similar types of projects

Management level:

 Use of same bodies to implement different funds to facilitate synchronisation and links at governance level (in particular Horizon "co-funds")

Proposed bridges and links between EU funds

Open to receive voluntary transfers from any CPR Funds to:

- Any Fund covered by the CPR, any Fund under the shared management or any instrument under direct or indirect management.
- 10 proposed EU programmes explicitly mention the receipt of transfers (Horizon Europe, Digital Europe, Single Market Programme, InvestEU, Creative Europe, Erasmus+, Space Programme, Rights & Values Programme, Reform Support Programme, Connecting Europe Facility)

Cumulative funding:

 Horizon Europe, Digital Europe, Single Market Programme, LIFE, Creative Europe, Space Programme, CEF, Euratom, Erasmus+, Customs Programme, Justice Programme, AMF, ISF and BMVI

Seal of Excellence or equivalent:

 Horizon Europe, Digital Europe, Single Market Programme, LIFE, Creative Europe, Space Programme, Defence Programme, CEF2, Rights & Values Programme, Justice Programme, Erasmus+, AMF, ISF and BMVI



Synergies in the implementation phase

Financial level:

- **Sequential funding**: draw on results of previous EU funding for new projects (better information on projects, e.g. via www.innoradar.eu, mapping of infrastructures, MoUs ...)
- Alternative funding (Seal of Excellence): under ERDF rules with less red tape and more possibility to align ERDF funding to other programmes' conditions
- Transfer of up to 5% to directly / indirectly managed EU funds, implemented under rules of the receiving fund
- **Cumulative funding**: joint possibly pro rata funding for projects, with each part under own fund's rules

Management level:

 Managing Authorities may identify Horizon (DEP, SMP...) implementing bodies (incl. "co-funds") as intermediate bodies for implementing ERDF funds under ERDF rules

2019 European Semester and next steps

- More effective link between the European Semester and EU funding for 2021-2027
- Country reports provide the analytical basis for a successful programming of Cohesion policy funds in 2021-2027 (Commission's starting negotiating position)
- Annex D on investment guidance for cohesion policy funding 2021-2027 is a thematic summary of investment actions under POs 1-5
- Launch events (March and April) in every MS marked the start of a dialogue between Commission and MS
- MS to submit roadmaps by June 2019



Urban Agenda for the EU

- European Commission working with cities, Member States and stakeholders to strenghten urban dimension in EU policies
- 'Air quality' is a priority theme
- Results:
 - Action plan published
 - Input to Air quality Fitness Check
 - o Code of good practices for cities' Air Quality Action Plans
 - General business model to fund air quality measures (+ pilot tested in Milan)
 - Health Impact Assessment tool
 - Communication toolbox to raise awareness on air quality





Urban Innovative Actions

- EUR 371 million, to experiment novel ideas (Art. 8 ERDF Regulation)
- 5 projects already awarded for air quality (October 2018):
 - Métropole Aix-Marseille Provence (open source data-exchange platform)
 - Breda (off-grid energy for outdoor events)
 - Helsinki (data, co-design and participative budgeting)
 - Ostrava (municipal greenery)
 - Portici (pollutant mapping)
- Last call (September 2019) will again include air quality
